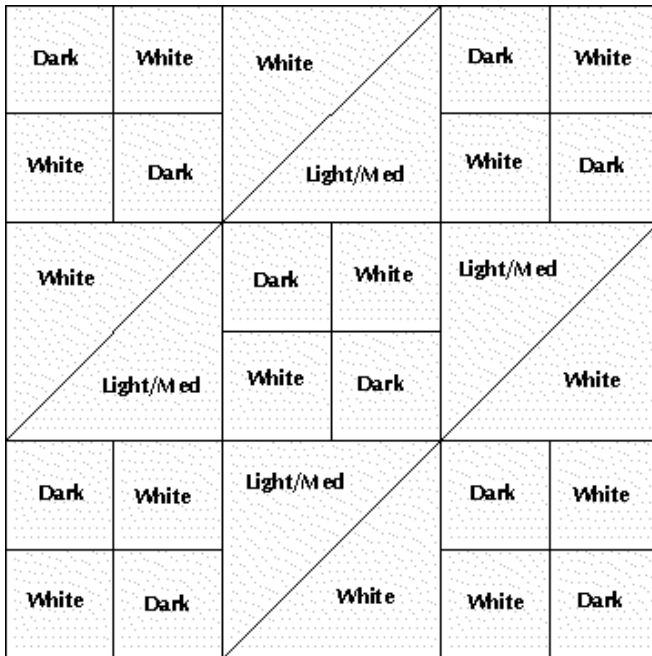

**Jacob's Ladder**



Jacob's Ladder is a block I have always liked...it creates a couple of secondary designs the really appeal to me. We will be making it with 3 colors: light/med, a dark, and a light shown as white on the diagram. We will be making this one 12" finished.

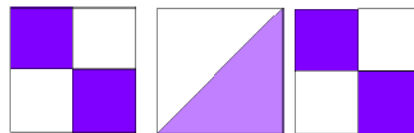
For your light/med and dark, think Crayon colors.

You need to cut as follows:

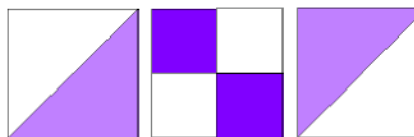
1. White: cut two 5" squares; cut 1 strip 2-1/2" x 26"
2. Light/Medium : cut two 5" squares
3. Dark: cut 1 strip 2-1/2" x 26"

Sewing Instructions:

1. Draw diagonal line on wrong side of both the 5" white squares. Match right sides to right sides of same size light/medium squares; stitch 1/4" on either side of diagonal mark; cut apart on diagonal mark; press seams toward light/medium fabric. Square up half-square triangles to 4-1/2"
2. Sew a 2-1/2" white strip to the dark strip of the same size; press seams toward dark.
3. Cut ten 2-1/2" sections from strip created in step#2. Match a pair of units and stitch to create five 4-patch units; press seam either way. Square up new units to 4-1/2".
4. Sew a four-patch unit to either side of a half-square triangle...make 2 units; press seam toward 4-patch.



5. Sew the last 2 half-square triangle units to either side of the remaining 4-patch; press seams toward 4-patch



6. Using graphics as a guide, stitch a unit from step#4 to either side of a unit from step#5; press seams toward center unit
