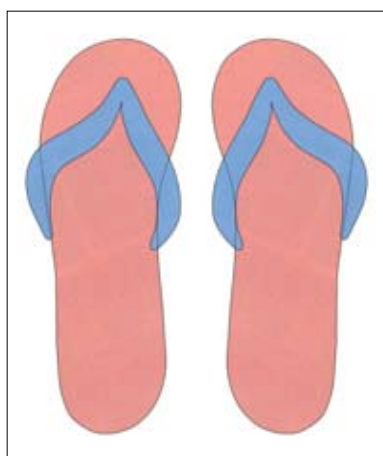


# Block-of-the-Month—August 2010

## Summer Flip Flops



Cut 1 rectangle from white fabric 8.5" x 10"

Cut each flip flop out of your brightest, wildest prints.

The strap can be applied with contrasting fabric or can be three-dimensional using ribbon. Get creative!

(I cut each ribbon 5.5", cut a slit to insert each side at the toe and just tucked it under at the sides—before I ironed it down)

Applique, using your choice of methods.  
(Fusible, raw edge, hand or machine)

### TIP-OF-THE-MONTH

When using fusible interfacing follow the manufacturer's directions for the amount of time to iron. **THIS IS IMPORTANT!** Too much time and the sticky stuff might bleed through, too little time and the paper won't peel off.

When peeling the paper off the back, score it with a pin to get started.

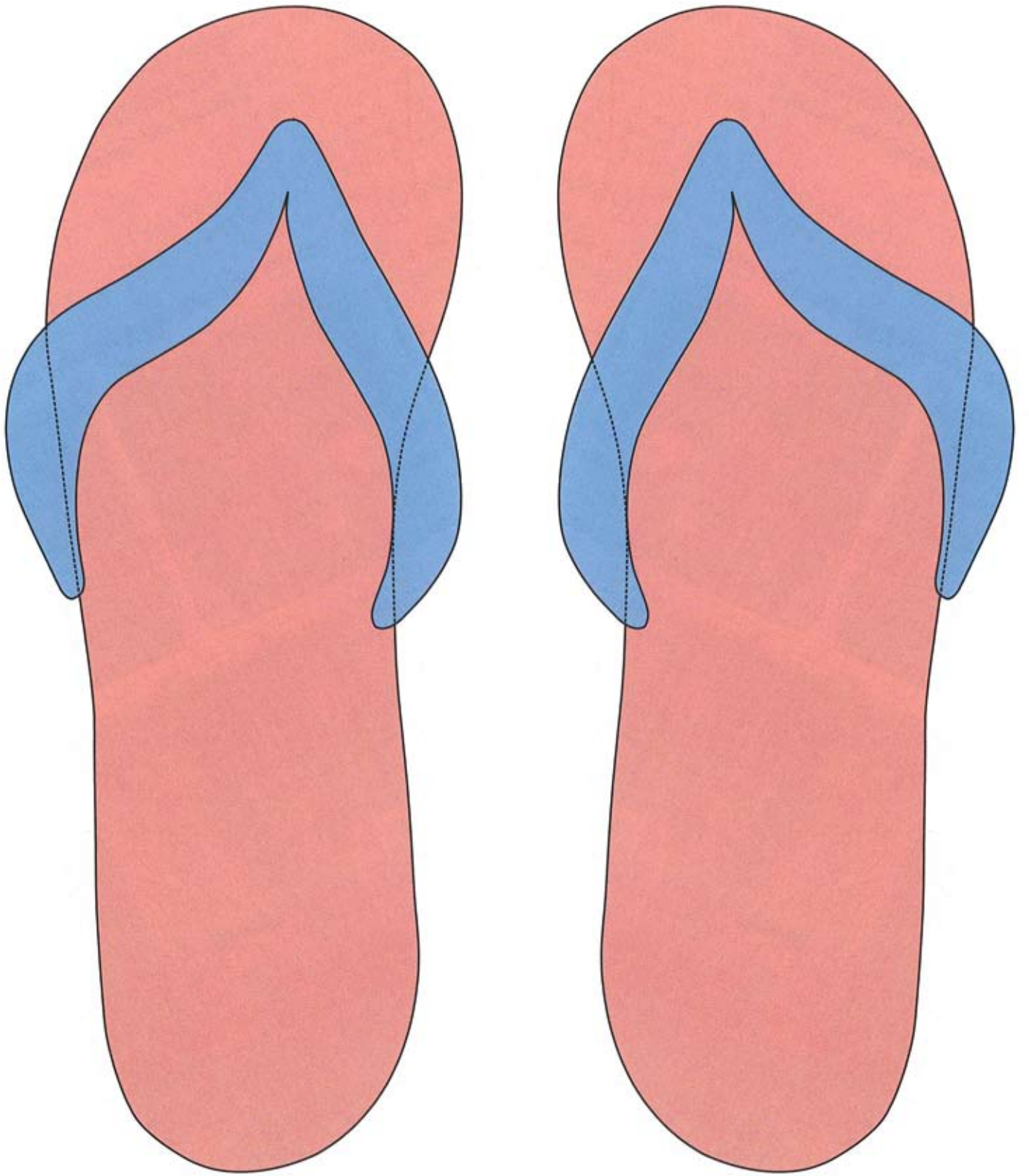
And be sure to protect your iron and ironing board by placing your pieces between paper or scrap fabric. You don't want your husband to get gunk on his shirt. (Don't ask me how I know this)
